# Definitions

- International applicant = student requires or possesses a valid Visa other than a B (visitor) Visa. (Most common: F, H, J)
- Permanent Resident = student possesses a valid Permanent Resident Alien Card (AKA Green Card or A-Card) *or* an I-485 form (Application to Adjust Status) showing s/he has applied for permanent residency\*

\*DU exception



## Definitions Cont.

- Asylee/Refugee = student possesses an I-94 form (Refugee/Asylee/Parolee/Victim of Human Trafficking) or I-797 Notice of Action (receipt notice) showing that Form I-589 (Application for Asylum) has been filed and is pending. Alternately, student may possess a T-Visa (Cuban Haitian entrance).
- Undocumented = student does not possess any legal paperwork documenting lawful presence in the US. May hold a B (Visitor) Visa. However, B-Visa is not valid for study in the US.



# Processing/Decisions Impacted by...

- *Applicant type* (e.g., domestic vs international)
- *Credential type* (e.g., visa/pending status type)
- *Academic background* (e.g., years in the US, ESL courses)
- *Federal requirements* (e.g., Sevis reporting)
- *State requirements* (e.g., HEAR, CCHE index)
- *Institutional mission/role*

# CCHE/HEAR Requirements

- CSU and Metro must adhere to CCHE/HEAR guidelines. CCA and DU do not.
- CSU and Metro guidelines differ slightly in regards to index scores and age groups held to guidelines
- Students who have not been mainstreamed from ESL classes by the time they begin their Junior year will not meet HEAR English requirements



# CCHE Admissions Standards (Index)

- The following...undergraduate applicants are exempt from the Commission's freshmen and transfer admission standards:
  - [Degree-seeking] applicants who have a **foreign (non-U.S.) transcript**. The Commission directs the individual institutions to evaluate, to the best of their ability, the foreign credentials presented by the student to assure that they are of an equivalent level to those students admitted under the Commission's standards. (5.02.01.01)

*Please note that the exception is based on credential type, not applicant type.*



# Higher Education Admission Requirements (HEAR)

- The following students are exempt from the Higher Education Admission Requirements (HEAR):
  - Students who have a **foreign (non-U.S.) transcript**. (4.04.05)
- HEAR & ESL course work:
  - Two units of ESL English may count for HEAR requirements when combined with two units of successfully completed college preparatory English.
  - College-preparatory ESL mathematics/science courses that include content and academic rigor/level comparable to other acceptable courses may satisfy HEAR requirements.

*Please note that the exception is based on credential type, not applicant type.*



# Application Highlights

- Determined by citizenship/legal status
- International students apply as international students regardless of visa type or where they live
- Permanent residents and PR-pending apply as domestic students. (Exception DU: PR-pending=international)
- Asylees apply as domestic students.
- Undocumented students apply as domestic applicants and are considered non-residents. (Exception DU: undocumented=international)



# Required Document Highlights

- Determined in part by citizenship/legal status and in part on credentials/academic background
- All schools require an application of all applicants.
- Transcripts are required. (Exception: CCA)
- Fee required. (Exception: CCA no fee req'd)
- SAT/ACT scores may be required depending upon academic background and applicant type. (Exception: CCA never requires SAT/ACT)
- Personal Statement and Recommendations are always required by CSU and DU, sometimes by Metro
- Variety of financial/immigration documents required depending on school and applicant type



# English Proficiency Highlights

- Determined based on citizenship & academic background
- All international students must submit a form of English proficiency in order to be unconditionally admitted as a degree seeking student.
- Acceptable forms of English proficiency vary by school. Most schools prefer TOEFL.
- Metro and CCA accept Accuplacer. CSU and DU do not.
- For all other populations requirements vary by school.



# Unique Decision Factors

- CSU and DU conduct holistic review of all applicants.
- CSU does not weight SAT/ACT scores as heavily if student has completed fewer than two years at a US high school
- Metro has more specific guidelines based on age and applicant type.



# Conditional Admission

- CSU and DU offer conditional admission based on English proficiency
- CSU requires TOEFL/IELTS of all international students. DU does not require TOEFL/IELTS for conditional admission
- CSU may offer conditional admission to Permanent Resident, Asylee/Refugee, Undocumented applicants without TOEFL if they have lived in the US less than two years and/or have not been mainstreamed from ESL classes
- Conditional admission for undocumented students applying to DU is usually not necessary if the student will earn a US high school diploma



# Tuition/Scholarship/FAFSA/COF Eligibility

- International students are not eligible for FAFSA. May be eligible for in-state tuition and COF depending on length of time in CO and visa status. May be eligible for scholarships depending on school.
- Permanent residents (Green Card holders) are eligible for FAFSA. May be eligible for in-state tuition and COF depending on length of time in CO and when documents were issued. May be eligible for scholarships depending on school.
- Asylee/Refugee: see chart for details
- Undocumented students are not eligible for FAFSA, COF, in-state tuition or scholarships funded by state funds. May be eligible for scholarships at DU (merit based) and CCA.



# Challenges

- Getting official foreign transcripts/translations and immigration documents
- Exchange students who will not graduate from their home country high school or US high school
- Placement tests and placing into college level courses
- Getting accurate information from the student
- English proficiency
- Confusion regarding status and applicant type
- For DU, switching Permanent Resident applicant to PR with Green Card
