



# FORWARD STEPS PROGRAM



## What is the Forward Steps Program?

Forward Steps supports Colorado's current and former foster youth as they pursue a post-secondary education. Our program provides financial, social and life-skills support to foster youth who are currently enrolled, or will be enrolled, in an associate, bachelor, trade or certificate program from a public educational institution.

Full-time Forward Steps scholars can receive up to \$6,000 per academic year for unmet financial need related to cost of attendance, with the potential for additional summer funding. The program can accommodate part-time enrollment on a limited basis as well.

In addition to financial assistance, Forward Steps scholars receive one-on-one mentoring, academic and career coaching, opportunities for personal and professional development, access to tutoring, and community support.

## Who is eligible to apply?

Applicants must meet all the following criteria:

- Applicants must have verifiable experience in the foster care system.
- First time applicants must apply before their 26th birthday.
- Applicants must be residents of Colorado and plan to attend (or are currently attending) one of the following colleges. Please note that other Colorado colleges will be considered.
  - Arapahoe Community College
  - Colorado State University, Fort Collins
  - Community College of Denver
  - Emily Griffith Technical College
  - Front Range Community College – Westminster & Boulder campuses
  - Metropolitan State University of Denver
  - Red Rocks Community College
  - University of Colorado, Denver
  - University of Northern Colorado, Greeley
- Scholars must have a high school diploma or a GED before beginning their first semester of college.
- Applicants must meet federal financial aid requirements and have unmet need as determined by the FAFSA.

## What is the application process?

Interested candidates can complete the application on our website and submit it via email or mail. **Priority consideration is given to applications received by May 31st, 2020**; however, we do accept applications throughout the school year. Applications received after the priority deadline may be considered for the upcoming semester depending on the date the application is submitted, applicant eligibility and available funding. Forward Steps accepts scholars for both fall and spring semesters.

Eligible applicants will be contacted to schedule an interview. Our review committee, which may include members outside of our organization, will then review eligible application packets. Applicants will be informed of the review committee's final decision regarding program admittance by email.

## What is expected of scholars who are accepted into the program?

To remain eligible, scholars must meet the following expectations:

- Maintain good standing as defined by their school.
- Maintain and successfully complete all credit hours as agreed upon with Forward Steps.
- Achieve and maintain at least a 2.0 GPA both cumulatively and per semester.
- Meet with the Scholar Mentor as agreed upon, per program requirements; additional visits may be scheduled depending on scholar needs.
- New scholars are required to attend Forward Steps' College Prep 101 workshop.
- Participate in workshops and personal/professional development activities, including a volunteer service day organized by Forward Steps. There are typically 2-3 required workshops or activities per semester that are focused on areas of scholar interest.
- Complete self-assessments and program evaluations, as requested.
- Submit grades and/or progress reports as requested.

## How does Forward Steps partner with professionals?

Forward Steps exists to help former foster youth develop meaningful post-secondary skills which will enhance their independence. Our approach is individualized and specific to the needs and interests of our scholars. Partnerships are of utmost importance in setting up our scholars to succeed.

We are committed to partnering with the agencies and individuals who have been crucial in managing the students' cases and who have valuable insight into how we can best serve our scholars. Forward Steps' goal is to provide programming and services that would be most useful to the scholars without replicating services. We aim to have a clear and open line of communication with all relevant parties.

## Can applicants who were previously declined re-apply for the scholarship?

Yes, we encourage any applicants who were previously declined to reapply to our program. Admittance decisions often depend on the number of applicants and amount of available funding for a given semester. Individuals who would like to reapply will only need to fill out our application form and provide any updated documentation as requested.
